## Vatican historical panel approves Delille bio

A commission of historians with the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints has overwhelmingly approved the official biography submitted in the beatification cause of Mother Henriette Delille, foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Family in pre-Civil War New Orleans.

Dr. Andrea Ambrosi, the Rome based postulator of Mother Henriette's beatification cause, wrote Archbishop Alfred C. Hughes Oct. 8 that the six members of the historical commission had approved the "positio" - the comprehensive biography of her life - at a two-hour meeting Oct. 7.

Ambrosi told Hughes in his letter that the vote was overwhelmingly positive. Each of the six historians was asked to respond to three questions, for a total of 18 responses.

Ambrosi said there were 17 positive responses and one suspensive vote, which is not negative.

"As you can understand, this result comes to us as higher than any of us anticipated," Ambrosi said. "We must thank the Lord and trust in his protection for the Servant of God Henriette Delille."

Mother Henriette, a free woman of color, founded the Sisters of the Holy Family in 1842 in New Orleans in order to attend to the spiritual and physical needs of slaves and the elderly. She did this in an era in which Louisiana law prohibited the education of slaves.

Mother Henriette's cause now will be forwarded to the congregation's theological commission, which will review not only the historical documents with respect to her life and virtue but also make a determination of



## Abp. presents Delille bio to Pope

Archbishop Alfred C. Hughes took another step in the Vatican's exacting process for the possible beatification of Mother Henriette Delille by personally presenting Pope Benedict XVI with the official biography of the foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Family on Dec. 3.

At the conclusion of the pope's general audience in the Paul VI Audience Hall in Vatican City, Archbishop Hughes handed the pope a white, leather-bound copy of the official "positio" of Mother Henriette, who founded the congregation of African-American women religious in New Orleans in 1842 to teach the slaves and care for the elderly.

The positio is an academic study that contains a presentation on the life, reputation for sanctity of Mother Henriette, who is recognized by the church as a Servant of God. . . .

"I reminded the Holy Father of his previous intercession and support for her beatification and canonization," Archbishop Hughes said. "I also mentioned that a miracle has already been assessed medically in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston and has been submitted for medical certification in Rome. He expressed gratitude and hope that the cause could move forward."

Sister Eva Regina, superior of the Sisters of the Holy Family, said she was overjoyed that Archbishop Hughes had been able to make the presentation directly to the Pope.

"Lord, have mercy, we're just so happy it occurred," Sister Eva Regina said. "It's overwhelming. We're filled with joy

whether her life and virtue were "heroic."

"We're contending that they were, No. 1, because of the kind of life she had to leave behind in order to enter the life she led," Archbishop Hughes said, referring to the cultural expectations that Henriette would become a mistress to a white aristocrat. "Second, she had the courage to offer education and health care services to slaves when that was forbade by state law. Third, she formed a religious community for black Catholics in a whitedominated Catholic Church at

that time."

If the theological commission approves the positio, medical experts then must evaluate a miracle that has been attributed to Mother Henriette's intercession. It involves the healing of a Houston girl from life-threatening double pneumonia and internal bleeding 11 years ago.

Below are a few excerpts from Mr. Cabey's talk.

"I know how well they work for I am a product of their care and nurturing. I remember my very first real encounter with the Holy Family Sisters. It was Christmas of 1950. I was in the seminary at Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, about 60 miles from New Orleans. All the seminarians were

going home for Christmas, but two of us from the West Indies and two from Belize in Central America. We could not afford to go home. The Sisters of the Holy Family came to the rescue, took us in at the Lafon Home for Boys in New Orleans and provided for us what I consider to be the best Christmas ever.

They fed us well and showered us with Christmas gifts. . . . After all these years I still fondly remember Sister Florence, Sister Ann and Sister Martin de Porres. They left a lasting impression on me. I will never forget the care and concern I received from those Sisters at Notre Dame Seminary. The names that come to mind are Sister Leontyne, Sister Magdalen and Sister Sarah.

The influence of the Holy Family Sisters on Black Priests and Brothers is very great.

"We all know that one needs money and clout in order to get a person canonized. The Holy Family Sisters have neither. But what they do have is a dedicated band of people who pray with them for the canonization of their foundress, HENRIETTE DELILLE. I am in that prayer group and would ask all of you to join in."

## The Garifuna Mass

The annual Garifuna Mass was held for the first time after Hurricane Katrina at Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos Catholic Church on Dauphine Street, November 9, 2008. Under the direction of Mrs. Maria Elena Zuniga, and Mrs. Austra Zapata, a small choir and drummers practiced steadily since October for the event.
